

## Series 7 - Family Expenditure Survey

**Description:** The UK Family Expenditure Survey (FES) is a continuous survey with an annual sample of around 10,000 households (about 1 in 2000 of all United Kingdom households) about 60% of which co-operate by providing the interviewers with information about the household, household and personal incomes, certain payments that recur regularly and in maintaining a detailed expenditure record for 14 consecutive days. The original purpose of the survey was to provide information on spending patterns for the United Kingdom Retail Price Index (RPI).
